Groupthink: In collaborative environments, the desire for consensus can stifle diverse viewpoints, leading to poor decision-making.

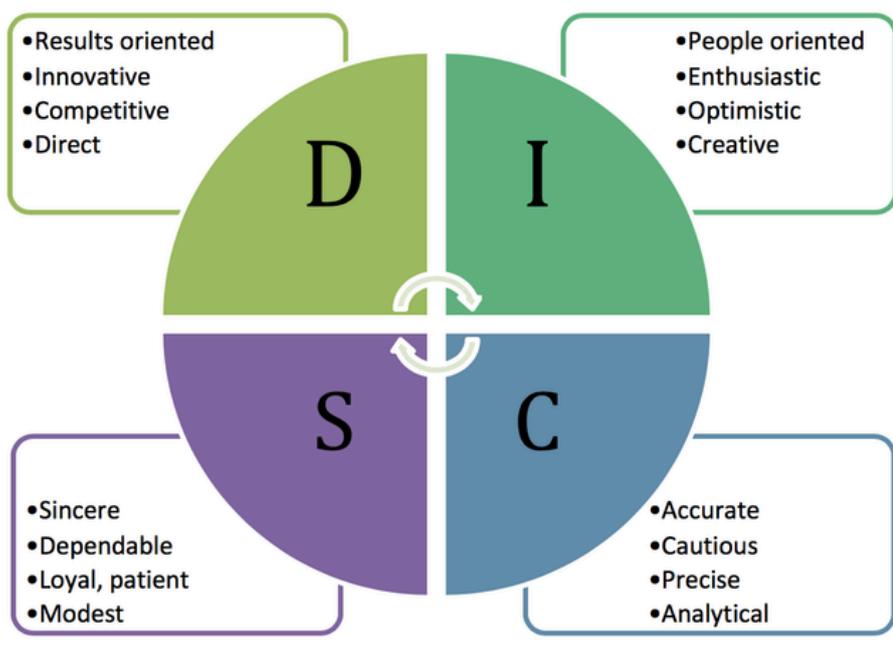
Stress and Burnout: High-pressure competitive dynamics may push employees to overwork, resulting in stress and burnout.

Inefficient Processes: Poorly defined roles in collaborative settings can create redundancy or confusion about responsibilities, slowing down workflows.

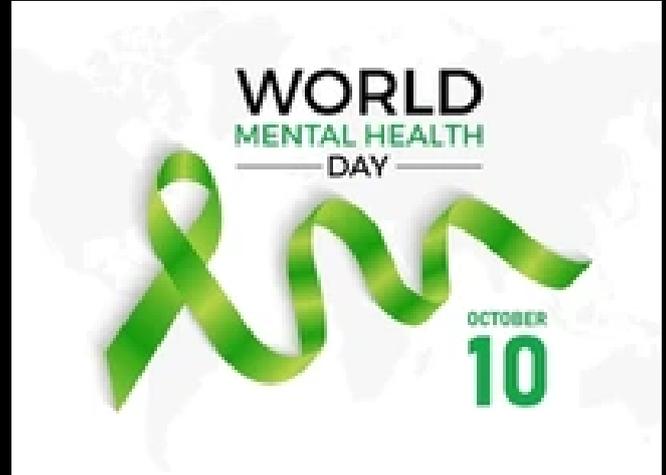
